Primary Focus:

To enhance the campers physically, mentally, and socially through the use of recreation, education, socialization and rehabilitation programs in a year-round setting. Programs stress personal motivation, self-confidence, leadership and self-reliance in a fun-filled outdoor atmosphere.

Camp activities include arts/crafts, gardening, canoeing, camping, nature quest, fishing, archery, dramatics, music, horseback riding, track and field, swimming, tandem biking, sports and games. All buildings are air-conditioned. Medical personnel are on duty 24 hours daily. The camp staff includes personnel with experience working with the visually impaired.
