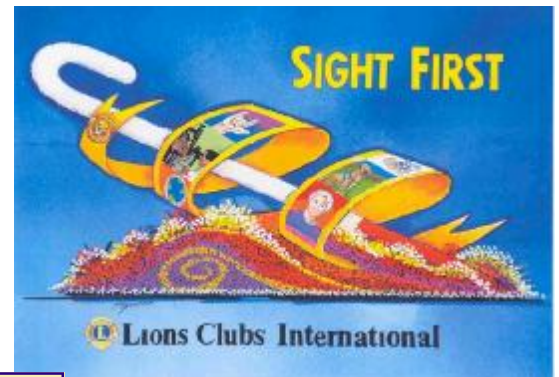
LQ On-Line
