New Member Orientation

The causes and treatment of hearing impairments include:

- trauma to the ear; hearing aids can often enhance hearing which has been damaged from excessive noise or an accident.
- an obstruction in the ear canal; the removal of ear wax, a tumor, or other object can often remedy this situation.
- chronic middle ear infections; tubes can be surgically placed in the middle ears.
- a loss or fixation of the small bone in the middle ear; often, surgery can repair this condition.
- a gradual deterioration of the inner ear and hearing nerve endings, or a combination of a transmission (conductive hearing) loss and an inner ear hearing loss; in most cases, hearing aids can amplify sound.
- a hole in the eardrum; often, surgery can repair this condition.

Types of hearing aids include:

- digital hearing aids
- computer programmable (hybrid) hearing aids
- analog (non-programmable) hearing aids
- rechargeable battery hearing aids
- disposable hearing aids
- bone conduction hearing aids
- implantable hearing aids
- Styles of hearing aids include:
 - BTE - behind the ear
 - ITE - in the ear

- ITC - in the ear canal
- CIC - completely in the ear canal
- CROS - for persons with a hearing impairment in one ear

Additional devices can aid the hearing impaired

- Amplifiers
- Personal FM systems - provide wireless, portable amplification of sound up to 300 feet (91 meters).
- Personal amplifiers - aid in one-to-one communication and in television viewing.

Telephone devices

- Loud ringers - amplify the sound of ringing telephones.
- Portable telephone amplifiers - adjust the volume of telephone conversations.

• Telecommunications Device for the Deaf (TDD or TTY) - utilize a keyboard to communicate across telephone lines.

- An adapter - prevents audio feedback when persons with hearing aid(s) use an amplified phone.

Television devices

- Closed Caption Decoders - transform words spoken on a television program into written words which appear at the bottom of the television screen.

• Infrared television listening systems—include headsets or earpieces which amplify sound through a wireless television system.

Household alerts

- A smoke detector - uses a strobe light.
- A wireless doorbell - features a strobe light.

• Alarm clocks - models are available that feature flashing lights or the shaking of a bed pillow.

- A telephone alert - models are available that feature strobe lights or flashing lamps.

Automobile alerts

- Turn signal reminder - this increasingly loud sound warns drivers that the vehicle's turn signal remains engaged.
- Emergency vehicle detector - this warning light system detects an emergency siren within a 1000 foot (305 me-

ter) radius of a vehicle.

When conversing with someone who is hearing impaired, remember to:

- talk in a well-lit room and away from background noises;
- face the person (so your lips can be read). If an interpreter for the deaf is utilized, direct your communication to the hearing impaired person, not to the interpreter.
- speak slowly, distinctly, and naturally. Shouting distorts the lips and face thereby hindering lip reading.
- certain speech sounds may be difficult to hear. If this situation occurs, rephrase your message.

- ask the hearing impaired person for methods of improving interpersonal communications.
