11. All club Monthly Membership Reports mailed by the end of the month.
12. Each zone hold three zone meetings with all clubs represented.
13. Thirty-five percent club participation in the Peace Poster contest.
14. Sponsor at least two Lions Quest workshops for teachers in District 18-D schools.

Georgia Lions Lighthouse - PDG Norm Masters

Mobile Eye Clinic had to be shut down because it was too expensive to operate. More information about this decision is forthcoming. White cane collections this past year for District 18-D totaled \$32,372.57. Only 35% of the clubs have appointed an associate director to the GA Lighthouse. Those clubs who have not appointed an associate director should do so ASAP. Two checks were presented by the Snellville Lions Club: \$1500 to the GA Lighthouse Foundation and \$1000 to the GA Lions Children's Eye care Center.

Leader Dogs for the Blind - Lion David Buice

While at the Camp for the Blind this year, we talked to five campers and they became applicants for Leader Dogs. They had been coming to the camp for several years. They graduated high school this year and will be on their way to college. One application has been accepted and he will be attending the next session at Leader Dog School. There have not been a lot of applicants from Georgia so hopefully all five of these will be approved. One school used the quarter folders and turned in \$125. General Motors is about to sign a service contract for the school and then, much needed repairs can be completed. Checks presented: Gainesville-Lanier \$200 and Snellville - \$1000.

Extension Chair - Lion Margaret Battle

A way to make up the lost membership we have been talking about is through the formation of new Lions clubs. This is a way to get a large increase in a hurry. Currently, a group in the Atlanta area has been contacted and could become a new club. Lion Margaret made a plea to all club presidents and past district governors to sponsor and help organize new clubs. Lion Marilyn Caldwell of the Peachtree Club will be working with Lion Margaret and they are hoping for great things this year with the formation of new clubs.

Report of the Audit Committee - Lion Gary Vaughters

Records were reviewed. All money owed to the district has been properly paid by all the clubs. All district expenses have been paid. Records from last year are complete and there was a good accounting of all money. A check for \$1873.42, representing the carry over from last year, was presented to the District Governor who turned it over to the District Secretary-Treasurer. A motion was made and seconded to accept the audit report. Motion carried unanimously.

Report on the International Convention - PCC Buddy Ouzts

Lion Buddy was appointed to the board and took his seat on the board. The board decided to stay with the budget that was prepared before the dues increase was approved and work with the personnel currently on the payroll. There was a cut back of 31 people (mostly retirements) which cut the budget by \$900,000 from the international budget. Non-dues revenues in now coming in from printing for Quest International and Rotary Clubs International. Passing of the dues increase was a great accomplishment and it will enable Lions Clubs International to move forward and get money back into the reserves that had to be used to operate. Lion Buddy was put on the Executive Committee of LCIF. He plans to report at one of the cabinet meetings exactly what LCIF is doing and what they have donated in and participated in throughout the world. International is gearing up for electronic reporting.

REPORTS

Council Chair - Dan Stuart, PDG

PDG Stuart emphasized the district goal to increase membership and maintain district status. According to the bylaws, any district that falls below 1250 members or 35 clubs has two fiscal years to get back above those numbers or they will be placed on "transitional" status. Several districts, including 18-D, are below these numbers. Any district that becomes "transitional" gets an appointed District Governor instead of electing one. Redistricting is currently being discussed and Council plans to appoint a committee to study the districts in the State of Georgia.

Lion Dan also spoke about the need for participation in the event planned for October 23rd in conjunction with Lion Jim Ervin's Board Meeting. Reservations must be in by September 10, 1999. He said "I guarantee you it will be an experience of your Lions career".

Lions Clubs International Foundation - PDG Tom Sexton

Prior to giving his report, Lion Tom completed some unfinished business from last year. He presented checks for district scrapbooks that had been entered and received recognition in state competition. Toccoa and Winder Noon tied for first place, Gainesville second place and Union County third place.

Lion Tom explained the operations of LCIF to the newcomers to Lionism attending a cabinet meeting for the first time. LCIF needs the support of the clubs and personal support through Melvin Jones Fellowship or Contributing Member. Some clubs have donated to LCIF and may have funds that can be used toward a Melvin Jones Award. This information is available from International. Gainesville-Lanier presented a check for \$255.

International Convention and USA/Canada Forum - VDG Ed Hashbarger

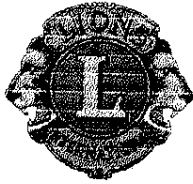
Lion Ed stated that Dr. Pearce covered the Forum in detail but he did want to emphasize that the price will go up August 15th. He said this is not only a leadership forum but it is also educational.

State Convention will be held in Augusta May 19 - 21, 2000.

International Convention is scheduled June 19 - 23 in Honolulu, Hawaii. He recommends couples married in June make this a second honeymoon. And if you were not married in June, it will still make a great vacation. International President Jim Ervin will be passing on the gavel at this convention.

Membership Chair - Lion Beverly Shirley

Lion Beverly spoke about International President Ervin inviting all Lions to cruise with him on four special ships and she talked about the most important ship - membership. To motivate membership she brought Lion Ervin's motto for this club year "Each one reach one". Special awards are planned for membership growth and they are outlined in this month's Lion Magazine on Page 29. She stated now is the time to strengthen our clubs. Her home club, Clarksville, just recruited two new members and she challenged each club to end the year with a plus in membership - not a deficit.

Call to Order

The First Cabinet Meeting of the Lions Year 1999-2000 was called to order by District Governor Joseph Hirsch at 2:00 p.m.

Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

The Invocation was given by District Chaplain Del Von Almen. (A copy is filed with the original copy of these minutes). The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Vice District Governor Ed Hashbarger.

Welcoming Address

District Governor Hirsch expressed his appreciation to the Oconee Lions Club and invited Club President Bruce MacKenzie to present his welcoming address. President MacKenzie welcomed everyone, on behalf of the Oconee Lions, and thanked them for coming to their community for what they hope will be a memorable and productive meeting.

Roll Call & Installation of Cabinet Officers

PID John Pearce was asked to conduct the Installation of Cabinet Officers. He made two important announcements before starting.

1. The USA/Canada Forum will be held September 16 - 18, 1999 in Birmingham, Alabama. This is the closest the Forum will be to this area for the next five years. There is still time to register. To date, 2800 Lions have registered.
2. International President Jim Ervin is holding his board meeting in Atlanta in October and on the 23rd, there will be a banquet and all Lions are invited. They are hoping for three to four hundred in attendance. An international director will be seated at each of the tables. Tickets are \$30/person. Clubs not attending are asked to donate \$60 to cover two of the 120 invited guests. Clubs sending representation can also donate.

PID Pearce called roll as he introduced the Cabinet Members for District 18-D. The entire cabinet was present. Lion John challenged the cabinet to get on International President Jim Ervin's four ships as we go into the next millennium and start with "Fellowship". Get to know who the people are in your zone or region. This will be the start and sailing onto the other three ships will be easy. He

challenged each officer to "make something new happen in their position this year". All officers pledged they would accept this challenge. All other Lions pledged to support the officers through out this next Lion Year. Officers were declared duly installed.

Approval of Minutes from the Last Cabinet Meeting

Minutes of the last cabinet had been distributed prior to the meeting. Past CST Don Wagner, PDG reported that the minutes for the May 2nd, 1999 meeting were mailed to the cabinet within the 10 day requirement. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as presented. Motion carried.

Report on the Camp for the Blind - PDG Don Wagner

Lion Don Wagner, District Vice President for the Camp for the Blind asked to give his report for this project was he was still at the podium. The 1999 camp season has been very successful and a great part of it was due to the work of Camp Director Shannon Nettles visiting clubs and social agencies of behalf of the Camp and its program. All clubs have not named their Associate Director and this should be done. Trust fund as of July 22, 1999 is \$320,713.66. (Copy of the written report is filed with the original copy of these minutes). Checks presented for the Camp: Gainesville Lanier Lions Club - \$250; Snellville - \$1,500.

Appointment of the Audit Committee

Lion Gary Vaughters was appointed to chair the audit committee and he will assisted by Lions Larry Smallwood and Don Hix. The financial report was tabled until after the audit was completed.

Resolutions

Approval of the bank for the District Checking Account. Motion to approve passed unanimously.

Approval to levy and collect discretionary dues. Motion to approve passed unanimously.

A copy of these two resolutions, as presented, are filed with the original copy of these minutes).

District Goals

DG Hirsch summarized his goals and placed special emphasis on membership. He echoed International President Ervin and urged "Each one to reach on". Currently the district is at 1218 members and the criteria, from International, to be a district is 1250. Redistricting is one solution, but he stated "I am not going to let that happen". The opportunity to increase membership exists in this area. Other goals include service to youth, initiate Lions Quest Programs while continuing with the projects associated with Lionism.

Candidate Resolution

PDG Irving Hellenga, Resolutions Chair stated the resolutions committee is always ready to accept resolutions. A resolution has been submitted for this meeting and he asked PDG Don Hardigree to read the candidate resolution. The resolution, adopted by the Winder Noon Lions Club, endorsed PDG A. Lamar "Buddy" Ouzts as a candidate for director in Lions Club International. The resolution was accepted by Lion Hellenga and passed on the DG Hirsch for action. A motion to approve was made and seconded. Motion carried unanimously.
