A BRIEF HISTORY

The Marietta Lions Club was organized with members in July, 1942. Little Five Points (now Northeast Atlanta) was the sponsoring club. The charter was presented September 4, 1942 by District Governor W. Joe Scott.

Beginning with a fish-fry in August 1942, the club has continued to be active in service activities which required fund-raising projects. The latter have varied from sponsoring professional entertainment to the recent broom and mop sales. The club did a local-talent ministrel show for three years and sponsored a horse show for ten years.

The first service project was the placing of the "Moral Code for Youth" in the city schools in October, 1942. The project was repeated in both city and county schools in 1946. The recreation room of the U.S.O. at Dobbins Air Force Base was equipped during World War II. A fully equipped rescue truck was donated to the Fire Department in 1952. Materials were furnished to construct a band room for the Marietta High School Band in 1951. From 1947 through 1963 the club sponsored Hobby Fairs where children displayed their hobbies, pets and participated in a clown parade. The P.T.A.'s had booths at the same events to raise funds for their projects. The club has sponsored a Pony League ball team every year since 1951.

Sight Conservation has been the major service, as it is with many Lions Clubs. For more than 20 years the club has purchased glasses for needy people; for several years this has amounted to 80 to 100 pairs per year. We have been supporters of the Lions Lighthouse since its beginning. Equipment has been provided to the County and City Schools for eye examinations. In 1956 the club furnished the equipment for the Eye Clinic at Kennestone Hospital. The funds were raised by the first club sale of Scripto pen and pencil sets for which we had a feature story in the Lions Magazine. The club also pays for all medicines dispensed by the clinic.

Marietta Lions have also been involved in Lionism beyond the local club by attending International, State and District meetings. Many of the members have served on the District Cabinet. Everett Livingston was District Governor and Jabez Galt was Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer in 1950-51. Jim Cochran is presently serving as Zone Chairman.

The Marietta Club has sponsored the clubs, namely: Smyrna, Alpharetta, Brookhaven, East Marietta, and Acworth. and Colbb.
